

FOSTER CARE

You have been the helper of the fatherless.

---Psalm 10:14

King Solomon writes, "Children are a heritage from the Lord, the fruit of the womb a reward" (Psalm 127:3), which is to say that children are always a precious gift from God. A husband and a wife do not bring children into this world; only God does. He alone creates life at conception (Psalm 139:13), and he alone takes children from their mother's womb (Psalm 71:6). Therefore, having children is not a right or a guarantee but always and only a gift from above (James 1:17).

It is with this understanding that my wife and I have prayed for such a gift for almost four years. Like any gift from our Father, we do not demand this from him but are always waiting with open arms to receive what he desires to give. And as of right now, it has not been his desire to give us children.

And so, while we continue to ask, as we know he continues to hear, we have come to the decision to begin the process of fostering children. We want to be clear that such an undertaking is not meant to "fill the void" of not having children of our own. This is not our way of "fixing the problem." But rather, since the Lord has not opened Hannah's womb (Genesis 30:22) and thus has also not filled my quiver (Psalm 127:5), he has therefore left us with the resources and the time to serve his children in a different way.

In the foster care system today, there are over 400,000 children nationwide and 10,000 statewide. These are kids whose parents, for various reasons, cannot currently care for them. It is always the goal of foster care to reunite these children with their biological parents, in which is the best case scenario for any child to be raised. Therefore, Hannah and I are not going into this with the hopes of adopting children, although we are certainly open to the possibility. It will be difficult for us to keep this perspective in mind, as we will no doubt grow to love the children placed in our care who are not ours. Hopefully, such care for these children will only be temporary, so that they can return to the people God has ordained to be their father and mother. It will be a challenge to remember that these children we foster aren't our own, but because they aren't our own, it will be even more difficult to care for them as many will come from broken homes, with parents who may have abused or neglected them.

As we venture into this, we ask that you help us keep this proper perspective in mind. Hannah and I don't want to do this for ourselves. We want to do this to love our neighbor, to love parents in need of some help and to love

children who are in need of a home. Please pray for us, as we know you have been. We are excited to provide this service, and it's our prayer that, through us, the Lord would bless the fatherless in such a way that they might know of their true Father who art in heaven and his dear Son Jesus Christ, who desires to prepare a place for them in his Father's house (John 14:2).

Why do we celebrate feasts?

The word "feast" or "festival" is used to describe a particular day in the Christian Church Year when we celebrate certain people or events. There are the Major Feasts which will always be observed no matter what, such as Christmas, Ash Wednesday, Easter, or Pentecost. But there are also other Minor Feasts that are scattered throughout the year, which may or may not be observed. Here at Grace, if one of those Minor Feasts falls on a Sunday, we will celebrate it at the regularly scheduled Divine Service, or sometimes we will transfer it to the closest Sunday, such as when we celebrate Reformation Day (October 31st) and All Saints' Day (November 1st).

Our Lutheran fathers taught us the importance of celebrating these feast days, especially those that commemorated a saint (meaning "holy person"). We don't do this to venerate or praise the saints, but rather all glory is given to God who has worked through these servants throughout history. The Apology of the Augsburg Confession (Article 21) gives three reasons for such honor:

First, we thank God for giving faithful servants to His Church. Second, through such remembrance our faith is strengthened as we see the mercy that God extended to His saints of old. Third, these saints are examples by which we may imitate both their faith and their holy living according to our calling in life (*Lutheran Service Book*, page xii).

We celebrate the saints for the sake of Christ, whose blood has cleansed them of their sin and thus made them saints. These people did not live flawless lives, but, by God's grace, they are counted righteous for Christ's sake, and their lives were used by God for the good of the Church. Their lives continue to bear witness to us to strengthen our faith in order to emulate them, as the book of Hebrews instructs us: "Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us" (Hebrews 12:1).

In June and July, we will be celebrating four feasts on different Sunday mornings. On June 4th, we celebrate the Holy Trinity, as we do every year after Pentecost. On June 11th, we remember and give thanks to God for St. Barnabas, who worked tirelessly with St. Paul in their mission work to the world. June 25th remembers the presentation of the Augsburg Confession before Emperor Charles V in 1530. And then on July 2nd, we celebrate Mary's visit to her cousin Elizabeth, in which St. John the Baptist leapt in his mother's womb at the sound of the Virgin's greeting. We have much to celebrate these coming months!
