Have you noticed that during the last two decades there has been a resurgence of interest and fascination in supernatural phenomena, featuring everything from movies, books, and TV shows about ghosts, demonic possession, paranormal, exorcisms, occult, and satanic worship? With all that has been written and produced it can be difficult to ascertain fact from fiction. Are these things real? Do we have documented evidence of such things? Do they affect our daily lives? What do we do about these things? You've got real questions and Dr. Robert Bennett has real answers.

In anticipation of our congregation's 75th anniversary in November 2024, we will have a hymn chosen for the month that will be used during the Divine Service. The hymns of the church give God's people the words to sing his praises and to confess what he has done for them in the saving death and resurrection of his Son Jesus Christ.

I Trust, O Christ, in You Alone LSB 972

This Reformation hymn, written by Conrad Hubert (1507-1577) boldly proclaims the Lutheran understanding of justification. We are declared righteous before the Righteous Judge solely by his grace, without any merit or worthiness within us.

The first stanza makes this clear when we put our trust in Christ alone, knowing that "no earthly hope avails me" and "no human strength, no earthly power can see me through the evil hour."

In stanza two, we pray for true contrition that we might receive God's forgiveness won for us in Christ's "death upon the tree" and be free from our sin and guilt that plague us. The risen and ascended Son of God continues to "recall [his] matchless deed of love" before the Father so "that he may lift [our] dreadful load."

In stanza three, we shift from the first person singular ("I" and "me") to the plural ("we" and "us"), teaching us that we do not stand alone, but as the Church militant, we hear the Word of God together, living out our various vocations, and awaiting the day when our Savior bears us safely home.

The tune for this hymn will be unfamiliar to us, but over time, we will learn to love the music attached to these sweet words of comfort, as we trust in Christ alone. 1 I trust, O Christ, in You alone;
No earthly hope avails me.
You will not see me overthrown
When Satan's host assails me.
No human strength, no earthly pow'r
Can see me through the evil hour,
For You alone my strength renew.
I cry to You!
I trust, O Lord, Your promise true.

- 2 My sin and guilt are plaguing me;
 O grant me true contrition
 And by Your death upon the tree
 Your pardon and remission.
 Before the Father's throne above
 Recall Your matchless deed of love
 That He may lift my dreadful load,
 O Son of God!
 I plead the grace Your death bestowed.
- 3 Confirm in us Your Gospel, Lord,
 Your promise of salvation.
 And make us long to hear Your Word





Aaron Reinbold called the meeting to order. Pastor Haller opened with a reading and devotion from Matthew 18 and closed devotion with prayer.

Review of July Voter's Meeting minutes. Motion to accept the minutes by Joanne Reinbold and 2nd by Leslie Reinbold. Motion carried and approved.

Treasurer's Report ~ Mary Masker

- Balances as of end of August, checking account balance at \$33,379.83.
- \$320 collected this quarter for our special mission, the Bethesda group home in Frankenmuth. One more Sunday in this quarter for collections. St. Lorenz has special committee working to keep the homes open and Wellspring is now working with them as well.

Church Properties ~ No Report

Elders ~ **Steve Reinbold**

- First men's Saturday morning bible study and breakfast had 9 men in attendance. Next meeting will be on October 21st.
- Christi Diener has transferred into Grace's membership and the Bender family is in process of transferring in.
- Still working with a few delinquents, but with not much success.
- Lutheran school tuition assistance forms were turned in and tuition paid to Trinity Lutheran School.
- Had a good turnout and new banners for the Bean Festival parade.
- Lining up Pastors for return visits to preach during our Anniversary year in 2024: Pastor Johnson in April, Pastor Astrowski in May, Pastor Bickel in July and Pastor Petersen in October. Pastor Will Weedon will be preaching the Anniversary service on November 10th.
- Elders had flowers once in September and will again in October.
- Next meeting will be on October 3rd. Reviewing the budget for 2024 is on the agenda.

- Parade banners were expensed to Evangelism, but will be transferred to Elders budget under worship supplies.
- The Advertiser yearly bill was received and turned in for payment.
- Decided that we may want to hold off on next church directory until after the church anniversary to be able to include pictures throughout the year of the anniversary festivities.
- Planning a family game night on Friday night, January 26th with a back-up date of February 2nd. Will plan on possible free will offering for popcorn and hot cocoa and maybe making dry soup mixes for sale with proceeds going to the clothing drive. Always taking donations for school supplies and clothing throughout the year for the clothing drive.
- Budget to be determined.

Ladies Aid ~

- Ladies Aid will supply desserts for 75th Anniversary dinner if needed.
- Ladies Aid will serve the first Advent dinner.

Stewardship ~ Joanne Reinbold

- Coffee money for October and December will go to the Good Samaritan Fund, benefitting the Akron-Fairgrove Ministerial Fund. November coffee collections will go to our seminary student. Pastor Haller suggested supporting Ian Habicht again during his 2nd year and Nathan Bublitz, now attending seminary in St. Louis. Stewardship board to determine if we can support both.
- October Mission envelope designated to Luther Classical College. November Anniversary envelope goes in the Building Fund. Thanksgiving goes to Bethesda home in Frankenmuth. Lessons in Carols service collection proceeds go to Wellspring Lutheran Child & Family Services. Christmas Eve candlelight service and Christmas Day collections stay here for Grace General Fund. New Year's Eve collection will go to POBLO.
- Our 4th quarter special missions collection will be going to Special Friends Camp. There will be information in the next newsletter about this program.
- Joanna Johnson graduated from her Deaconess program, so for 2024 Special Missions Epiphany collection, the proceeds will now be going to Orphan Grain Train.
- Stewardship budget will probably stay the same with the exception of adding a line item for a purchase of favors for the 75th Anniversary party for our members and those in attendance.

- Planning fundraisers and activities for next year. Our Junior gathering was cancelled and trying to see if we can work out a date to reschedule.
