



OUR 75TH ANNIVERSARY

So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God, built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Christ Jesus himself being the cornerstone, in whom the whole structure, being joined together, grows into a holy temple in the Lord.

On November 8, 1949, the name “Grace” was chosen for the body of believers that had been gathering together around God’s Word and Sacraments in Fairgrove for the last few years. The naming of the congregation was the official founding of the congregation.

Since then, God’s people have continued to gather, albeit in a few different buildings and with many different pastors. Countless children have been baptized and catechized. Several men and women have been joined together in the mystery of Holy Marriage. Many saints have been buried in the earth with the certain hope of the resurrection. God’s people have been served by God, as he continues to forgive them of their sins through the same means he’s been using since the time of the apostles: the preaching of his Holy Word, the cleansing waters of Holy Baptism, the comfort of Holy Absolution, and the satisfying food from heaven in the Holy Supper.

On November 8, 2024, we will be celebrating seventy-five years of God’s grace toward us sinners in this congregation. As we look forward to that day, each board of the Parish Planning committee has been tasked to come up with a way in which their group can help the congregation celebrate. On top of that, the Board of Elders has asked some of the previous pastors to return and preach for us: Rev. Scott Johnson on April 21st, Rev. Leonard Astrowski on May 26th, Rev. Paul Bickel in July, and Rev. David Petersen on October 20th. On top of that, we have invited Rev. William Weedon to speak at our Holy Conversation that year, as well as preach for our special Anniversary Service on Sunday, November 10th. He is the speaker for the online podcast “The Word of the Lord Endures Forever,” as well as the author of the devotional booklets we’ve used in the past for both Advent and Lent.

So, mark your calendars!

In the meantime, you can begin to celebrate this anniversary by giving thanks to God for your church. We must not take this place and these people for granted. The church is a gift from heaven and not an invention of man. It was built by Christ, who is our cornerstone. He continues to call us each by name into his Father’s house that we might sit at his feet and listen to his teaching and be invited to kneel before his altar as he feeds us from his nail-scarred hands. He is our Good Shepherd, and our congregation is joined to his universal flock of the past, present, and future, in Fairgrove and around the world.

Pray and give thanks to God for the great mercy he continues to pour out on us here at Grace.

In anticipation of our congregation's 75th anniversary in November 2024, we will have a hymn chosen for each month which will be used during the Divine Service. The hymns of the church give God's people the words to sing his praises and to confess what he has done for them in the saving death and resurrection of his Son Jesus Christ.

***The Clouds of Judgment Gather* LSB 513**

This "End Times" hymn is based off of parts from a 2,996-line poem written by Bernard of Cluny in the 12th century entitled *De contemptu mundi* ("On contempt for the world").

Stanza 1 is a call for us Christians to be watchful as "the time is growing late" and soon our judge will come in mercy and might "to put an end to evil and diadem the right." We look forward to and are unafraid of such judgment.

Stanzas 2, 3, and 4 all picture heaven with apocalyptic images. In the second stanza, the shadows and darkness of this world will be eclipsed by the heavenly light of Christ. Stanzas 3 and 4 describe what awaits us in glory in our "home of fadeless splendor" where we will "dwell as children who here as exiles mourn." This new heaven and new earth will be a "relief for all distressed" and "refreshment for the blest." Therefore, we are encouraged not to grow complacent while here on earth, but we must "strive now to win that glory, toil now to gain that light; Send hope ahead to grasp it till hope be lost in sight."

The words of this hymn open our eyes to see this world for what it truly is and to look ahead instead to the world to come. These words call us to repentance that we might be prepared for Judgment Day with hope and faith in the God of mercies.

This hymn is especially appropriate to sing during the month of November, as we celebrate All Saints' Day on November 1st and as the Church Year comes to a close with its theme focused on the end of the world and the Advent of our King.

Executive Director, Aaron Reinbold called the meeting to order. Aaron opened with a reading and devotion from Luke 13:4-5 and closed the devotion with prayer.

SECRETARY'S REPORT ~ Mary Masker

- Roll call was taken with 19 members present and 8 excused. Stephen and Jennifer Bender signed the constitution and were added as new voting members.
- Minutes reviewed from July 2023 Voter's meeting. Motion to accept minutes by Diane Spencer and 2nd by Joanne Hills. Motion carried and approved to accept the meeting minutes.

TREASURER'S REPORT ~ Mary Masker

- Handout showing checking account balance as of September 30, 2023 at \$14,339.93 and current balances of Designated Funds and Church Extension accounts.
- All except two special missions have been paid out. Still collecting Education and Mission Sunday envelopes for Luther Classical College. The 2nd quarter special missions collection designated for Bethesda is being held as we also have the Thanksgiving collection going to Bethesda. We are also waiting on determination of ownership of these group homes as St. Lorenz Church in Frankenmuth is working with Wellspring to determine if ownership can be purchased from AbleLight.

CHURCH PROPERTIES ~ via Tom Reid

- The properties board is keeping the same budget for 2024 as they had for 2023.
- The parsonage has been rented to Mike and Laura Starkey and a formal contract has been written up and they will take possession in November.

ELDERS ~ via Steve Reinbold

- Christi Diener was confirmed on July 30, 2023 as a new member. The Bender family, Stephen and Jennifer with their children, Charlie, Henry, Amelia and Fred were received as new members on September 24, 2023. The board has also approved the transfer request of the Pierce family, Sarah, Tristan and Allison to Trinity Lutheran in Reese.
- The elders continue attempts to contact delinquent members and encourage them to attend the Divine Service.
- The Bean Festival Parade float was a success with many members attending to walk or ride on a simple wagon with banners and a cross.
- Lutheran School Tuition Assistance was approved for 7 students for the 2023-2024 school year, all attending Trinity Lutheran School in Reese. Total cost was \$15,397 and paid in September.
- A Holy Conversation will be held on Saturday, November 11th with Pastor Bennett being the speaker and also preaching on Sunday, November 12th and another class during Bible class. Details for lunch to be determined.
- We have scheduled four of Grace's former pastors to preach during our anniversary year in 2024: Rev. Scott Johnson – April 21, 2024, Rev. Leonard Astrowski – May 26, 2024, Rev. Paul Bickel – July 2024 date to be determined, and Rev. David Petersen – October 20, 2024.
- The Elders board will be providing altar flowers on October 22, 2023.
- October elders are Aaron Reinbold as primary and Steven Reinbold as secondary. November elders are Joe Bublitz as primary and Daniel Reinbold as secondary.
- Next Elders meeting will be on November 7, 2023 at 7pm.

- The Hallers are almost completely moved out of the parsonage and plan on cleaning once done.

OLD BUSINESS

- Carillon repairs: Aaron Reinbold still trying to meet with Greg Carnes about repairs and disposal of old organ.
- Front sign: Sign replacement has been tabled at this time due to costs.
- Kitchen remodel update: Tracey Reinbold would like to meet with the contractor that did the Good Shepherd remodel and do a walk-thru to get further suggestions of what will work for our kitchen.

NEW BUSINESS

- Joanne Hills presented Stewardship board's Coffee Money and Special Missions designations for 2024. The only change was for Epiphany that will go to Orphan Grain Train. Joe Bublitz motioned to accept the coffee and missions as presented and Diane Spencer 2nd the motion. Motion carried and approved.
- 2024 Budget: Dan Reinbold motioned and Joanne Hills 2nd the motion to accept the 2024 Proposed Budget.
 - * Elders: Insurance decreased with the change to Blue Cross / Home Equity discontinued as of July with Pastor's move / Increase to Pulpit Assistance / Organist raised to increase Chelsea Worden's pay to \$80 per service and substitute organists pay to \$65, with choir remaining at \$35.
 - * Evangelism and Mercy: Increased overall budget to plan more community work and covering costs of activities.
 - * Young People's Work: Increased to help with cost for Higher Things. (2023 was decreased due to 2022 refund)
 - * Stewardship: Added line item for Church Anniversary gifts.
 - * Church Properties: No budget changes.
 - * Fellowship: Increased budget to help with costs for the Church Anniversary dinner.
- Joe Bublitz motioned to increase Pastor Haller's salary approximately 3.5% to \$65,400 for 2024. Brandon Worden 2nd the motion. Motion carried and approved.

Next Voter's Meeting will be on Sunday, January 7th, 2024.

Motion to adjourn made by Aaron Reinbold and 2nd by Dan Reinbold. Meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.
