

LORD, IN YOUR MERCY, HEAR OUR PRAYER

The life of every Christian ought to be structured by prayer. Often times, our schedules and pocket-planners organize our lives, keep things in order, and guide us each day and every week. But it really shouldn't be this way. That isn't to say we shouldn't get to work on time or follow up with our appointments, and yet, those things shouldn't control our lives and be the end-all-be-all to our day.

Instead, prayer should. In the morning when we rise, we begin with prayer, and our day ought to end the same way. In his Small Catechism, Luther teaches us to begin and end each day in prayer, making the sign of the holy cross with God's Triune name, reciting the Ten Commandments and the Apostles' Creed, using the Lord's Prayer as well as one Luther wrote himself, asking God's holy angel to be with us.

It is good to have prayer begin and end your day, to begin and end with the Lord. It's good to have your start and finish be blessed by him, rather than focused solely on yourself, the things you need to get done, or the worries and fears that trouble you. To pray is to rely upon God and to trust in him alone for all things, to cast your anxieties on him, knowing that he cares for you. Prayer lets your faith speak.

One of the ways the Christian Church has ordered each day for her people is through the daily services, specifically the orders of Matins and Vespers. These were offered every day for God's people to attend at their local parish, to order their lives with prayer in the morning and evening. For various reasons, most congregations now don't offer these services everyday, and yet, they're certainly making a comeback, being offered for some at least once a week.

That has been our practice here at Grace for the last few years, offering the opportunity to begin each Wednesday with prayer through the service of Matins. For those who are able, please take advantage of this great gift to gather with your fellow brothers and sisters in Christ and pray. There isn't a perfect time to do this that will work for everyone, but please consider making the sacrifice to be in Lord's house on Wednesday mornings, choosing prayer over whatever else may be on your schedule.

Also if you are able, a Bible Study is offered after Matins as well, to further meditate upon the Word of the Lord, which will no doubt bring about a great blessing to the rest of your week. Right now, we've recently begun a study on the book of Genesis, and everyone is welcome to join us.

For the other days of the week, take advantage of the Daily Prayer cards offered at the back table of the narthex along with the Family Altar sheets given out each week in the bulletin and posted on our website (www.gracefairgrove.org). Using these tools, God's Word and prayer will bring structure to your life so that the Lord would bless you everyday.

So, come, let us pray to the Lord, that he may be the beginning and end to all our days.

In anticipation of our congregation's 75th anniversary in November 2024, we will have a hymn chosen for the month that will be used during the Divine Service. The hymns of the church give God's people the words to sing his praises and to confess what he has done for them in the saving death

and resurrection of his Son Jesus Christ.

Who Trusts in God a Strong Abode LSB 714

Jesus Christ stood at the heart of Joachim Magdeburg's (1525-1587) theology. This hymn presents Magdeburg's trust that Christ not only forgives sins but also provides protection in the face of the fears, weaknesses, enemies, and tribulations that afflict believers. His salvation governs their lives even when all these foes attack and undermine the well-being of Christ's own.

Jesus bestows strength on believers in the face of Satan's hostility and the world's mockery, both of which Magdeburg had often endured. So the additional two stanzas of the hymn as published in the decade after his death appropriately expand his own confession. The second stanza recalls the words of Psalm 23, for the Divine Shepherd guides our steps, even in the face of death and hell. Nothing can separate or sever believers from their Lord (Romans 8:38-39).

Stanza 3 echoes this affirmation that Christ faithfully accompanies believers with His steadfast love and constant care through the battle against evil and temptation that haunts the lives of Christ's people. Because the Lord constantly renews them in "body, soul, and spirit," they are confident on the basis of salvation Christ won for them that they will stand at His right hand forever.



For those willing to support, specific envelopes can be found on the back table of the narthex.


