

## 75 YEARS OF GOD'S RICH GRACE

*In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace.*

—Ephesians 1:7

God is rich in his grace. He is extravagant and overwhelming with his love toward sinners. His mercy endures forever. And because of that, our cup overflows. We do not deserve any of this. We do not deserve God's provision day in and day out. We don't deserve the giving of his Son on the cross. We don't deserve the faith given to us by the Spirit to believe all that our Triune God has done. That is why it's called grace. It's a gift, not earned but offered, not a paycheck but an inheritance. God is rich in his grace.

For the past seventy-five years, God has poured out his grace on the saints of this congregation. In 1945, a small group of likeminded Christians in the village of Fairgrove surveyed the area and decided there were enough Lutherans to worship together in their hometown. Despite various bumps in the road along the way, the group was able to purchase a piece of property in October 1949, and the next month, on November 8th, they chose the name Grace for their church.

Since that time, the congregation has remained faithful to her Lord, as the Word continues to be preached in all of its truth and purity and the Sacraments rightly administered according to Christ's command. Countless baptisms, weddings, and Christian burials have taken place. Children and adults have been catechized in the faith. The people of God have served one another within the congregation and those outside of it, in our neighborhoods and around the world.

All of this has taken place by God's grace. This church is not our doing nor anyone else's from the past. It's the Lord's work, just as it's always been since the day of Pentecost, fifty days after our Lord rose from the dead. As St. Paul writes, "It is God who works in you to will and to act on behalf of His good purpose" (Philippians 2:13).

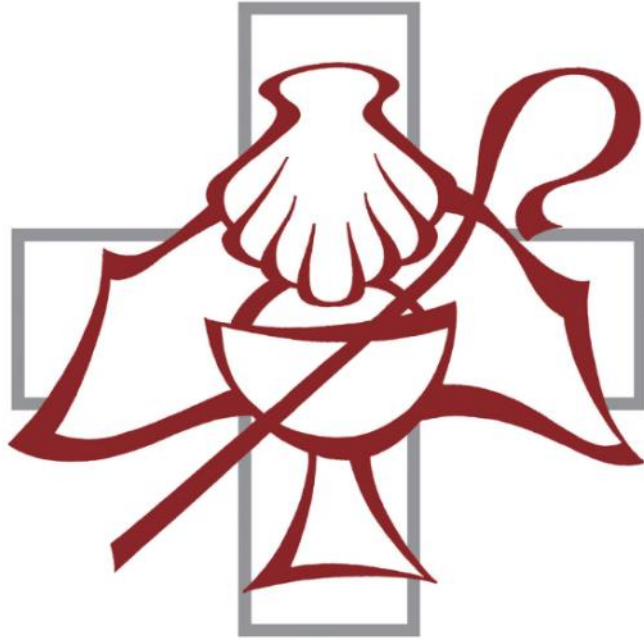
Let us give thanks to God for his faithfulness toward us sinners, that despite our many faults and shortcomings, he has still preserved a remnant in Fairgrove, a light shining in darkness, a city on a hill. And he will continue to do so for as long as he sees fits. No matter what the next seventy-years holds for this congregation, the Lord has promised for his Church: "the gates of hell shall not prevail against it" (Matthew 16:18). In this confidence, we stand and move forward. We continue to preach and teach, to obey our Father and serve our neighbor, to "walk in a manner worthy of the calling" (Ephesians 4:1). We continue to receive God's grace as its freely handed out to us from pulpit, font, and altar, even as we freely hand it out to our family, friends, and neighbors.

God is rich in his grace, always has been and always will be.

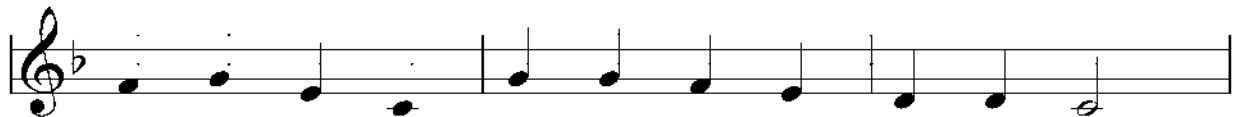

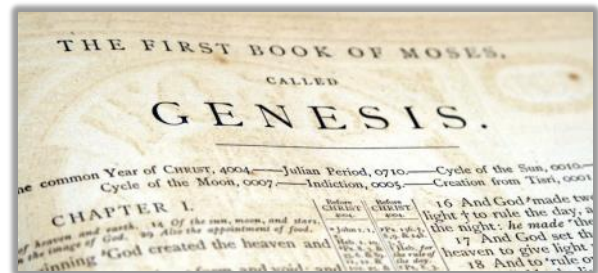

## **VOTER'S MEETING**

### **October 13, 2024**

Aaron Reinbold opened the meeting and Pastor Haller began with a devotion from Ephesians 5 and prayer.

#### **SECRETARY'S REPORT ~ Mary Masker**

Roll call was taken with 22 present and 1 excused. Irene Stange was added to the voting members. Minutes reviewed from July 14<sup>th</sup> voter's meeting. Motion to accept minutes by Diane Spencer and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Joanne Hills. Motion carried and approved to accept the meeting minutes.

#### **TREASURER'S REPORT ~ Mary Masker**

- Checking account balance as of September 30, 2024 was \$6,340.84. Paid out the 2024-2025 school year tuition that was just over \$25K total between Trinity and Valley Lutheran. Mary Masker transferred \$15,000 from designated funds to cover checkbook.

#### **CHURCH PROPERTIES ~ Aaron Reinbold**

- Made adjustments to budget for increasing rates.
- Will check into the kitchen faucet leak.

#### **ELDERS ~ Steve Reinbold**

- Elders sending letters to a delinquent member encouraging them to attend services because they have not responded/communicated with the pastor or elders. Please pray for all to come receive God's gifts.
- Pastor Petersen will be guest preacher on October 20<sup>th</sup> followed by a potluck dinner.
- Pastor Starke has finished our 75<sup>th</sup> church anniversary hymn. Elders giving Pastor Starke a \$100 gift card to Old City Hall in Bay City
- Pastor Weedon's theme for November 9<sup>th</sup> Anniversary/Holy Conversation, "One Generation Shall Commend Your Works to Another." Elders have paid for his travel expenses. Elders also providing a light lunch for Saturday, November 8<sup>th</sup> Holy Conversation session with subs, chips and cookies.
- Tuition Assistance was approved for \$25,605 for students attending Trinity Lutheran in Reese and Valley Lutheran High in Saginaw. This leaves a remaining balance of \$5,745 in the tuition budget.
- Reviewed and submitted Elders budget for 2025.
- Replaced copy machine with new one. About the same cost, \$152.29/mth with a 63-month agreement.
- October elders are Aaron and Steve Reinbold. November elders are Daniel Bublitz and Dan Reinbold.
- Next elders meeting will be on November 5, 2024.

#### **EVANGELISM AND MERCY ~ Leslie Reinbold**

- Clothing and school supplies give away was held July 20<sup>th</sup> and went very well.
- Had a float in the Bean Festival Parade. New t-shirts came just in time to wear in the parade.
- Planning a Family Game Night on the 5<sup>th</sup> Friday in January.

#### **LADIES AID ~ Diane Spencer**

- Still working on putting the church cookbook together.
- Sold pasties for \$7 each which were ready for pick up today.
- Sending Thanksgiving cards to all of our shut-ins.
- Will provide the altar flowers for the Anniversary service. Cindy Burnison also made a new banner.

#### **STEWARDSHIP ~ Joanne Hills**

- The board finalized their 2025 budget as well as the special missions and coffee money designations.
- October and December coffee money will go to the Good Samaritan Fund that benefits the Akron-Fairgrove Ministerial Fund. November coffee money will support our Seminary Student, Nathan Bublitz.
- Mission Sunday envelope goes to Luther Classical College. Thanksgiving Eve collection goes to Bethesda Project. Christmas Eve Choir service will go to Wellspring Lutheran Child and Family Services. The Candlelight service and the Christmas morning service proceeds will stay here at Grace. New Year's Eve collection will be to POBLO. The 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter Special Mission donations will be going to Orphan Grain Train.

## **YOUNG PEOPLE'S WORK ~ Tracey Reinbold**

- VBS evening event was held for Pre-K to 8<sup>th</sup> grades on August 7<sup>th</sup> with 13 children attending and Sr High students assisting. Activities, music and dinner concluding with an evening service.
- Higher Things 2025 early registration starts November 1<sup>st</sup> with one location in Grand Rapids.

## **FELLOWSHIP ~ Tracey Reinbold**

- Special treats served for Mother's and Father's Day and end of the school year with pies and floats.
- Good turnouts for the church picnic held on September 22<sup>nd</sup> with Aaron cooking pulled pork and the board supplying the sides and desserts.
- Pastor Petersen will be here next week and planning a potluck with chicken and ham supplied.
- Still finalizing plans for the church anniversary dinner.

## **PASTOR'S REPORT**

- Held celebration of life service for Lillian Wheeler on August 19<sup>th</sup>.
- Performed baptism for Julian Worden on September 1<sup>st</sup>.
- We have six youth in catechesis and six in high school catechesis.
- Wednesday bible class studying Genesis at 10am with Matins service prior at 9:30am.
- Sunday bible class studying Acts and the Large Catechism.
- Pastor Haller will be attending a conference October 14<sup>th</sup> – 16<sup>th</sup>.

## **OLD BUSINESS**

- Church Anniversary – Choir will begin practicing Mondays at 7pm starting this week to sing for the Anniversary service. Joanne Reinbold looking for church newsletters to add to the history she is gathering for a presentation between the service and dinner.
- Kitchen updates – Aaron and Tracey Reinbold and Joanne Hills visited several churches to look at their kitchens for ideas, took pictures and will discuss what will work best and what will be needed. They will be meeting on Friday at 8:30am.

## **NEW BUSINESS**

- 2025 Budget: Dan Reinbold motioned to accept the proposed 2025 budget and Joe Bublitz supported. Elders increased their budget for devotions as they plan to continue to pay for Portals of Prayer, Lutheran Witness and the Lent and Advent devotions. Evangelism and Mercy was decreased by some of the amount set aside for this year's anniversary. Stewardship increased the Synod/District/Seminary Student missions by \$500 each as this has not increased in quite some time, as well as adding another \$100 to Mission Festival and eliminated the church anniversary allotment. Church Properties increased the janitor's salary by \$200 as well as increasing the insurance and boiler inspection due to rising costs. Sandy D'Addezio proposed a 3% increase to Pastor Haller's salary of \$1962, making his 2025 salary increase to \$67,362. Motion was supported by Joe Bublitz. Motion carried and approved. Final motion to approve the 2025 budget at \$198,147 was carried and approved.
- Diane Spencer motioned and Dan Reinbold supported to approve the Stewardship boards list of Special Missions and Coffee Money donations as presented. Motion was carried and approved.
- Joanne Hills made a motion to accept the Board nominations as presented and Diane Spencer supported. Motion carried and approved. Aaron Reinbold encouraged each board to meet before the January voter's meeting to elect their board chairman.

Next Parish Planning meeting will be held on Tuesday, December 17<sup>th</sup> at 7pm.

Nest Voter's meeting will be held January 12<sup>th</sup> at 11am after church and fellowship.

Motion to adjourn made by Dan Reinbold and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Joe Bublitz.

Meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer and singing of the Doxology.
