

# A HOUSE BLESSING

It is made holy by the word of God and prayer. —1 Timothy 4:5

Often times when someone next to you sneezes, you might respond, "Bless you!" It's a good thing to say not just when someone sneezes but whenever a blessing might be appropriate, which is more often than you think. When we bless a person who's just sneezed, we are praying that they don't get sick, or if they are sick that they get well soon. We're hoping good things for them, which is really what it means to bless.

The word "bless" in the Bible literally means "to speak good words." It's where we get the word eulogy, which only states the good things about a person who's recently died. To bless someone or something is to speak good words, making that person or thing holy, as St. Paul writes that everything is "made holy by the word of God and prayer," for there are no better words than God's own words and the words spoken by Christians in prayer.

Therefore, a house blessing is simply using God's Word and prayer to set a house apart, making it holy. That's what you do every time you read your Bible at home, have a devotion with the family, and say your prayers. You're making your home different than other homes, different from the world. You are allowing the word of Christ to dwell in your home richly, so that Christ might abide there with you.

It's been a good practice of the Church to bless a home when a person or family first moves in or when something tragic might have happened in that home. It's also been a tradition to bless a Christian home every year during the season of Epiphany, a sort of new spiritual housecleaning. Just as the magi from the east visited the home of the Christ Child, so the Lord turns around and visits our homes through his Word and prayer. Even as Jesus wanted to come to the house of Zacchaeus, so he wants to be in yours in order to say: "Today salvation has come to this house" (Luke 19:9).

Throughout the season of Epiphany (January 6th through February15th), I am inviting you to invite me into your home to bless it. There is a simple rite our hymnal's agenda book offers that simply goes through the house, room by room, for as many or as little as you want, in order to speak the Word of God and to pray. This isn't a magical incantation but simply an opportunity for your pastor to bring good words into your home, thereby bringing the Good One into your dwelling place that he might dwell with you.

From now until February 15th, feel free to contact me and schedule your home's opportunity to be blessed.

# Why do we wait until Christmas to put up the Christmas Tree?

The answer is obvious, isn't it? A Christmas Tree is for Christmas, and since Christmas doesn't begin until the night before Christmas Day, we wait until then to put up our tree and the other decorations for the sanctuary. You might do things differently at home, and that's fine, but it's important to distinguish the season of Advent from Christmas in the Lord's house. Advent isn't simply the pre-Christmas season, but it very much follows the theme of the end of the Church Year, fixing our attention on Christ's second coming in glory. He first came in humility as a baby placed in a manger, but when he comes again on the Last Day, he will arrive with great power, as the One who laid down his life for the world, thereby defeating sin, death, and the devil.

Christmas is worth the wait, especially since our culture can't wait at all. Stores have had their aisles filled with red and green even before Halloween arrived. The month of December is dedicated to Santa Claus and his reindeer and every other classic movie shown on TV. And once December 25th rolls around, the decorations soon come down and everyone moves on with their lives.

But not in the Church. Christmas doesn't start immediately following Halloween or Thanksgiving. It starts the evening before December 25th and ends on January 6th, giving us a full twelve days of Christmas, as we journey with both the shepherds and the magi to see the Christ Child who was born for us and the whole world.

Just as we don't put out the lilies and other flowers sometime during Lent but wait until Easter, so we don't put out our tree until Christmas. When we enter the Lord's house during Advent, we are reminded that it's good to wait, even as we wait for our Lord to advent ("come") again on the Last Day. We wait with repentant hearts, turning away from our sin to the One who came down from heaven to give life for the world. He's always worth the wait, and so is Christmas.
