

YOU SHOULD BE IN CHURCH ON THURSDAY, MAY 29TH

When Jesus had said these things, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. —Acts 1:9

You should really be there. Thursday, May 29th, is the 40th day after Easter, and on that day, we celebrate that our Lord ascended into heaven forty days after he rose from the dead. During those forty days, he appeared to his disciples on several occasions to prove that he had indeed been raised from the dead in both body and soul. He allowed them to see the wounds in his hands and side. He broke bread and ate with him. He came again and again but now in a glorified body, a body that could pop in and out, to be there one minute and gone the next.

But after those forty days, it was time for him to be taken from their sight. Jesus would be with his church always to the end of the age, but he would be with them in a different way than before. No longer teaching on the seashore, no longer healing lepers and calming storms. Now, the Lord is with us through his Word and his Sacraments, whereby he bestows on us the fruit of his labor from the cross and empty tomb. That which he accomplished in his death and resurrection is hand-delivered to us in the preaching of the Gospel, the waters of Holy Baptism, the absolution of our sins, and in his body and blood on the altar.

Without his ascension, none of those gifts would be available to you. Jesus was taken from our sight for our sake, so that he could be with us always and even more intimately than ever before. Through his Word and Sacraments, we are united with Jesus, so that all that he has is ours.

This gives us great reason to celebrate. May 29th is not an ordinary day, but it is a holy day, a feast day. It's right up there with Christmas and Easter as a day in which Christians should take notice by coming to the Lord's house to receive his Word and his Sacrament, where he has promised to be.

You should be there. You should be in church on Thursday, May 29th, at 6 pm for the Divine Service. If you need to leave work early, do it. If you have to miss a practice or a game, do it. Reschedule any appointment. Write this service down in your calendar. Make every effort to be in the Lord's house on this most holy day.

This is an opportunity for you to go against the grain, to be different from the world. We all bemoan how our culture is crumbling and how our society has changed for the worse. Well, this is how you can make a change, how you can stand up and not fall in line with where the fallen world is heading. This is another opportunity for you to make a good confession that nothing is more important than your Lord, nothing is more vital than receiving his Word and Sacrament, nothing on earth will come between you and heaven. For when we gather on that Thursday, Jesus, the King of Heaven, descends to us, bringing paradise with him, that we might have a foretaste of the feast to come.

Thursday, May 29th, is a holy day, a different day, the church's day. You should be there.

Why is the paschal candle lit only during Easter?

The word *pachal* comes from the Hebrew word for the Passover and also has its root from a word meaning "to suffer." Paschal has also been used by the Christian Church as another name for Easter. And so, the paschal candle in our sanctuary can rightfully be called the Easter Candle. This candle intentionally stands next to the baptismal font, where a sinner is joined to the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus Christ, so that all who are baptized are killed, buried, and raised up. What takes place in those waters is what took place on Good Friday through Easter Sunday.

Because of this, the paschal candle is only lit during the season of Easter, beginning on Holy Saturday during the Easter Vigil, when we transition from darkness to light, from the cross to the empty tomb. At that service, the candle is blessed with a new fire, just as our hearts are rekindled with the fire of God's love that we might be prepared to share in the Feast of Light which has no end.

This candle remains lit throughout the season of Easter, which lasts for forty days, coinciding with the days our Lord appeared to his disciples after his resurrection. At the end of those forty days, our Lord was taken from their sight, as he joined himself to the power and glory of his Father. Although he could no longer be seen, he was still with his Church always to the very end of the age (Matthew 28:20), even as he is with us now through his Word and Sacrament. And so, on the day of Ascension, the paschal candle is extinguished, not signifying that Christ has "left the building," but that he is no longer visible. If Christ had completely abandoned us then we would have to remove the candle, but we don't. He is with his Church on earth through the preached Word, the waters of Baptism, and his body and blood on the altar.

The paschal candle remains unlit until the following Easter, except when there is a Baptism or funeral, the beginning and end of every Christian life here on earth. Again, Holy Baptism is a death and resurrection, just as a funeral is used to proclaim the resurrection for all those who die in Christ, knowing that "just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life" (Romans 6:4).




1. Sign up for a Sunday on the Flower Chart on the bulletin board in the fellowship hall.


