

## GOD NEVER TAKES A VACATION

*I will never leave you nor forsake you.*

—Hebrews 13:5

As you well may know, I love my annual trip to the Upper Peninsula. It didn't happen at all last year, so I plan on going back this summer and again in the fall. Just as Jesus often went up on a mountain by himself, so it's also good for me to get away, to vacate for a while, in order to come back somewhat refreshed and renewed to do the work the Lord has given me to do. I hope you are also able to do the same, as many of us do during the summer months.

However, I pray that if you take a vacation, you don't also take a vacation from the Divine Service. We should be in the Lord's house every week, for he invites us every week to be with one another, our brothers and sisters, and to receive from him the gifts he so richly gives in both his Word and Sacrament. And a vacation is no excuse to miss out on those gifts.

Imagine if God ever took a vacation from you, if he decided to take a break from loving you and caring for you every day. You couldn't survive. You rely upon him to give you everything you need to support your body and life. Therefore, he can't take a vacation. Even when he rested on the seventh day of creation, he was still working. He has to, lest the whole universe fall apart. All of creation depends on the Creator's constant watchfulness and maintenance. He cannot take his eyes off of us and the world around us, thus God can never take a vacation from giving, just as you can never take a vacation from receiving.

Imagine taking a vacation from eating, drinking, or sleeping. There are times when you can't do such things, but certainly not for an extended period of time. That would be dangerous! So also, we can't take a break from the most essential things in life, those gifts of God that give us eternal life – his Word and Sacrament. The Divine Service is more essential than food, drink, clothing, shoes, and all the rest. Without the means of God's grace, we are disconnected from the Vine, lost without our Shepherd, and divorced from our Bridegroom. The Divine Service keeps us in communion with God and his mercy toward us sinners.

Why would we ever want a vacation from him? For by coming to the Divine Service, our God in heaven indeed serves us here on earth. He gives us a break from this sinful, fallen world. He fills us with hope of when we will have an eternal rest from all that is wrong with us, when every day will feel like a vacation.

God never takes a vacation from you, and so you should never vacate from him. He who neither sleeps nor slumbers also doesn't take a week off from feeding his flock and tending to his sheep. The Lord's doors are always open every Lord's day, no matter where you might be. Chances are, there's more than likely an LCMS congregation in the area you're staying, and if there's not, maybe you should consider taking a vacation somewhere else. Either way, don't take a vacation from the one who will never vacate, leave, or forsake you.

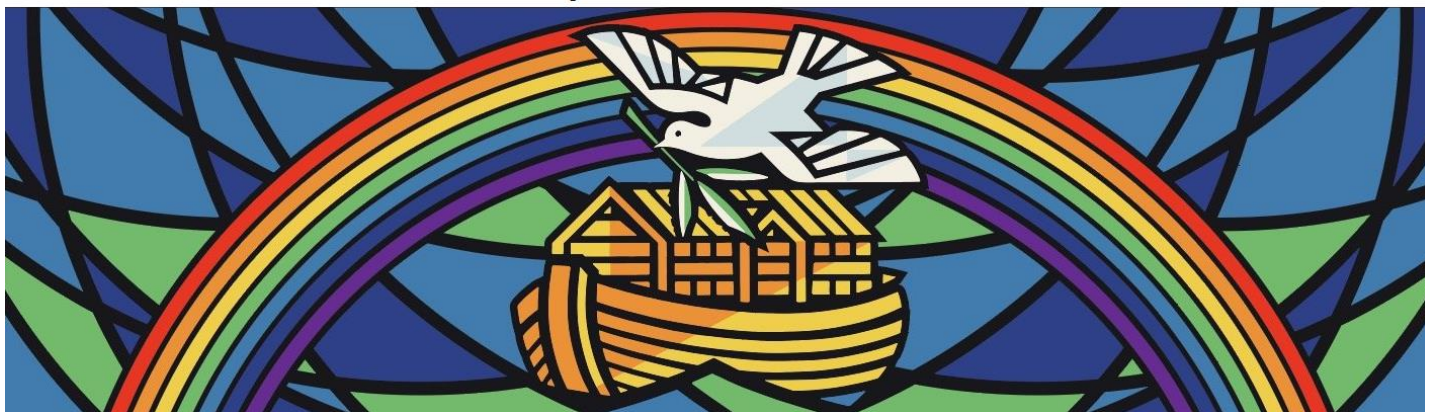
Every month, as a congregation, we will have a Bible verse to memorize, so that together the word of Christ may dwell richly in our hearts. Here is May's Bible verse:

# *Some notes on the Divine Service . . .*

*Enter his gates with thanksgiving, and his courts with praise! (Psalm 100:4).*

Everything we do in the Divine Service is focused upon what God is doing in the Divine Service. We believe our Lord Jesus is truly with us in the church, speaking to us through his Word and feeding us with his body and blood. Therefore, how we conduct ourselves should always be a reflection of what we believe is actually taking place. With this in mind, one of the ways we can do this is when we choose to enter and exit the sanctuary. There are appropriate times to come and go, so as not to distract others or take away from what is going on in the Service.

Therefore, out of reverence for what the Lord is doing in his house, the elders on duty will ask those entering the sanctuary to do so when it is most appropriate, so that the congregation's attention is focused upon receiving God's gifts and responding in worthy praise.

Following the order of the Divine Service, here are times when it is best to enter or simply to wait in the narthex:

**WHEN TO ENTER:**

- Processional Hymn
- Introit, Kyrie, Gloria in Excelsis
- Hymn of the Day
- Offertory, Offering, Announcements
- Distribution Hymns
- Recessional Hymn

**WHEN NOT TO ENTER BUT TO WAIT:**

- Confession of Sins
- Collect of the Day, Readings, Nicene Creed
- Sermon
- Prayer of the Church, Preface, Sanctus, Lord's Prayer, Words of Our Lord, Agnus Dei
- Nunc Dimittis, Thanksgiving, Benedicamus, Benediction

As we approach the month of May, I am beginning to feel and think about how my vicarage year is quickly drawing to a close. While the process takes time, we trust in the Lord's provision, knowing that He faithfully cares for all our needs. Rachel is also nearing the end of her school year at St. Paul Lutheran and looks forward to assisting with their "Summer Sunshine" program before we return to the Seminary.

Regarding next year, she has received a call to teach 4th grade at Child of God Lutheran School, and is excited to teach those students about the love God has for them.

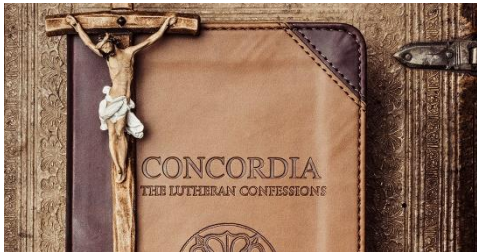

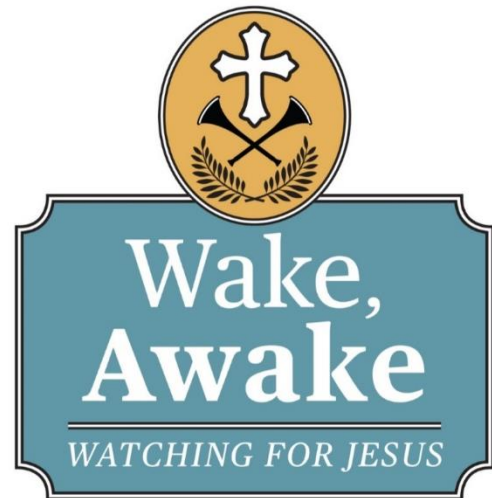
